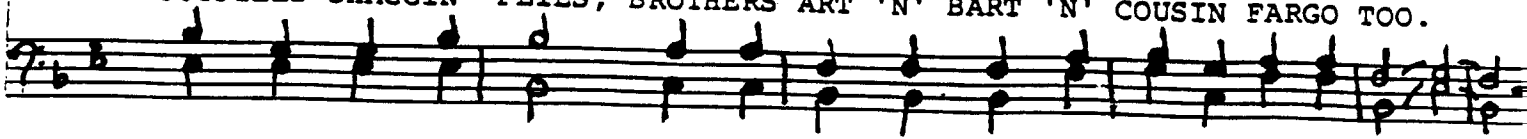

CATCHER'S UNDER THE BED.

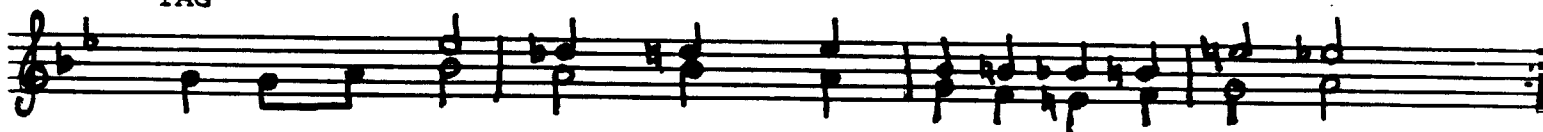
CHORUS
